

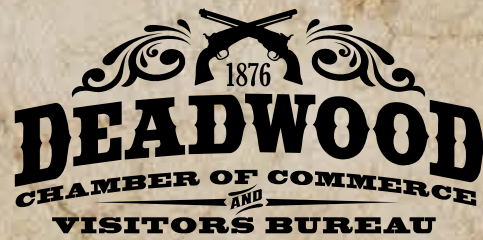

1. Tatanka: "Story of the Bison" is not accessible by foot or Deadwood Trolley from Downtown Deadwood. It is accessible by private car or via the special private Tatanka bus service originating in Deadwood.
2. The Broken Boot Gold Mine is accessible by private car, Deadwood Trolley, and by foot. However, it is about one mile from Downtown Deadwood, and may not be a comfortable walk for the disabled, families with small children or the elderly.
3. Mt. Moriah Cemetery is accessible by private car, one of the tour buses, or by foot. It is several blocks from downtown and is a difficult uphill walk, and may not be a comfortable walk for the disabled, families with small children or the elderly. Also, because of the steep grade and limited parking, large RVs or vehicles pulling trailers are not allowed on the route to the cemetery beyond Sherman Street. No pets allowed.
